Definitions

Class: any group of four or more entries. Classes with more than 25 entries will be split; classes/divisions with three or fewer entries may be cancelled or combined.

Division: Divisions will be pinned separately (except Great American/USDF Qualifying classes). At closing date, any division with three or fewer riders, will combine this division with the Open division and pin it as one class.

P: Ponies entering a pony division or class cannot exceed 148cm without shoes, or 149cm with shoes. Either include a copy of a USEF Dressage Pony Measurement Card, FEI Pony Measurement Card, or can be measured at the competition. **PR: Pony**

Rider: Open to Riders beginning in the calendar year in which they reach the age of 12 through the year that they turn age 16. Applies to FEI Pony classes only, not pony divisions in USEF classes.

J: Junior Rider: Open to riders through the year that they turn age 18 (Junior FEI tests – riders must be 14 through 18 years old). **J/Y:** combined Junior and Young Rider division. **Y:** Young Rider: Open to riders beginning in the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16 through the year that they turn age 21. **AA:** Open to Adult Amateurs only; competitors must compete as adults from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 22. Must hold current USEF Amateur card. **Q:** Qualifying class for 2007 Great American/USDF Regional Championships.

NAYRC Q: Qualifying class for the 2007 North American Advanced Young Riders Championship, open only to young riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 22.

NAJRC – Q Qualifying class for the 2007 North American Junior Rider Championship, open only to junior riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 14 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18.

\$20 USEF non-member fee for each non-member participating as a rider, owner, lessee, agent or trainer and \$5 breed/discipline fee (if applicable); voluntary \$1 contribution for Young Riders program; \$2 refundable deposit for show number; photocopy of USEF, USDF & RMDS membership cards to accompany entry, copy of current (within 12 months) negative Coggins test; out of state horses are required to have current health certificates (within 30 days). After closing date throughout competition days, no refunds of any kind for any reason, including Acts of God. Checks should be made payable to Dalwhinnie Ltd. AWARDS: Ribbons to 6th place for O, Jr, Jr/YR, AA with trophy for high score at each level. Awards given out at completion of each class, high point awards at the end of each level. Please collect awards before leaving the show grounds.

STABLING: At Dalwhinnie, \$35 per day, 2 bags of shavings provided. Additional shavings can be purchased from Dalwhinnie for \$10 a bag. All stalls have doors. No requests for stabling considered prior to Opening Date. Dalwhinnie reserves the right to determine stall allocation based on special needs, taking into consideration the safety and comfort of horses and participants. Indicate approximate time of arrival on entry as of Thursday afternoon prior to the horseshow. No earlier arrivals without making prior arrangements with Dalwhinnie. No tack/feed stalls.

ARENAS: All tests in 20 x 60 meters outdoor arenas. Warm-up indoors. All arenas polymer coated sand. Lunging only in designated pen.

ACCOMODATIONS: Ridgway Lodge (970) 626-5444 and Chipeta Sun Lodge (970) 626-3737 in Ridgway and The Beaumont recently opened in Ouray, for something more historical and upscale. There are additional accommodations in Ouray and Montrose. Call for more details. Please note that during the summer we are a tourist hot spot so make your reservations well ahead of time.

DIRECTIONS: From traffic light on Rt. 550, turn towards center of Ridgeway (Rt. 62), [.05 miles] go left [south] on Lena Rd., turn left at stop sign by Chipeta Sun Lodge B & B, continue for about ½ mile, passing the Solar Ranches on right. Watch for tan fencing on left and sign for Dalwhinnie. Please follow signs as posted on road and driveway to facilitate stabling, parking and traffic flow. Spectators with cars should come down main driveway and park on left of driveway, above main riding arena. From there it is foot traffic as a consideration for the competitors. All other vehicles should follow the trailer signs.

VETERINARIAN AND FARRIER: On call. Numbers will be posted at secretary stand and stable areas.

CONCESSIONS: Catering by Katriona and Justin (healthy food). For lunch, we will provide a box lunch with all the trimmings, please state whether you wish to order a box lunch and if you are a vegetarian. We are hoping that the Coffee Bug will be able to join us. Other food services available in town.

OTHER: Management reserves the right to cancel or combine classes and to add, change or cancel judges as number of entries indicates. There are no RV hookups on show grounds so RVs must be self-contained. Water, electricity, dumpsite NOT PROVIDED. DOGS ALLOWED ON GROUNDS LEASHED. OWNERS MUST CLEAN UP AFTER PETS AND KEEP IN PARKING AREA. Please observe this rule for the comfort of everyone. Porta Johns available in the parking area at Dalwhinnie. BARN FACILITIES AVAILABLE FOR RESIDENT BOARDERS ONLY. WATER AVAILABLE FOR HORSES TO DRINK AND IN BUCKETS FOR RINSING OFF HORSES. NO FULL BATHS PERMITTED DUE TO WATER RESTRICTIONS.

USEF Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides provided the respective breed/discipline dues or breed/discipline category fee has been paid. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$20 nonmember registration fee and a \$5 breed/discipline category fee for each breed/discipline. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions, 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Rule 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.
