Make checks payable to Paragon Equestrian. Mail entries to Secretary. Include a SASE!!! Provisional Ride times will be mailed if you include a SASE. Otherwise they will be posted on2whitefeet.com. Official ride times posted at 12 noon the day before each show.

SHOW COMMITTEE: The show committee reserves the right to cancel or split classes; limit class size; change arenas; limit the number of rides & number of horses per rider; and cancel or add judges. The show committee also reserves the right to refuse any entries for cause.

Pony Division: Ponies not exceeding 148cm without shoes, or 149cm with shoes must possess a copy of the USEF Dressage Pony Measurement Card or can be measured by an eligible Dressage Technical Delegate and judge/competition veterinarian. All ownership cards must be available for inspection and included with entry. FEI Pony classes are different.

ENTRIES: SEPARATE ENTRY NEEDED FOR EACH DAY! Accepted on first come, first served basis, based on (readable) postmark. Post entries (postmarked after closing date) will be accepted on a space available basis with late fee. Once the competition is filled a wait list will be established. Wait list will be maintained through August 23, 2007.

Current 2007 RMDS entry form must be used. Current negative Coggins as of 01/01/07 and proof of memberships and horse registrations must be included with entry. If riding freestyle include a copy of qualifying test. If entry is incomplete, horse/rider combination will be placed on the wait list until required paperwork is received. Numbers required at all times when horse is outside of stall. Entry form required if schooling only.

REFUNDS: Up to closing date, all fees refunded except office fee. From day after closing to day prior to competition, class fees will be refunded only if ride(s) can be filled from wait list. Qualifying fees and drug fee (if horse is not on show grounds) refunded. Stabling fees refunded if cancellation is on or before August 23, 2007. **After closing day, no refunds for Acts of God.** During competition days **no refunds. Office fee is nonrefundable.**

AWARDS: Trophy & ribbon to first place; ribbons through 6th place. High Point Awards. USDF/Dover Adult Amateur Medal for Classes #107, 207, 307.

STABLING: Permanent 12 x 12 stalls with full doors, bedding required but not provided. Shavings available on grounds, place orders in show office. **Stabling available at noon on Thur. August 23, 2007.**

ARENAS: Outdoor 20 x 60-meter show arenas, outdoor warm-up arenas; all sand mix footing. Arenas watered and worked throughout show. Show arenas open for schooling Thursday afternoon/evening until show office closes.

VET/FARRIER: On call, numbers posted in show office and stables.

EMT: On-Site EMTs.

CONCESSIONS: Food available on premises. Other concessions/vendors, contact show secretary.

OTHER: Dogs must be leashed at all times. Golf carts available for rent – Discount Golf Cars (303-744-3494).

USEF 301.5: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Rule 7. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides provided the respective breed/discipline dues or breed/discipline category fee has been paid. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$20 nonmember registration fee and a \$5 breed/discipline category fee for each breed/discipline. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions, 8) *Opportunity classes*, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.



2007 Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships

In 2007, a single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by The United States Dressage Federation (USDF), licensed by United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF Regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships. Please refer also to the comprehensive 2007 Regional Championship Program Rules which can be found on the USDF website or in the 2007 *USDF Directory*.

Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying & Championships:

Rider:

- Must be a USDF Participating* Member at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- Must be a USEF member (Junior Active, Senior Active, or Life) at the time the qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Horse:

- Must be USDF Lifetime Registered at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships. Horse registration must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) of record. If a current lease recording is on file with USDF, the lessee is recognized as "owner" for all USDF membership requirements.
- Must be USEF (Annual or Lifetime) recorded at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships. Horse recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s) of record.
- Horse is not required to have breed registry papers.

Owner:

- Must be a USDF member (Participating* or Business) at the time the qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- Must be a USEF member (Junior Active, Senior Active, or Life) at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

*Participating Members are USDF members who join USDF directly. Group memberships are not acceptable for this program.

2007 Minimum Qualifying Scores

One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for levels through Intermediate I, in three divisions: Open, Adult Amateur, and Junior/Young Rider. FEI Junior Rider and FEI Young Rider classes have only one respective division. Intermediate II, Grand Prix and freestyles have only Open divisions. The minimum percentages are as follows:

2007 Great American Insurance Group/ USDF Breeders' Championship Series



The Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series is a program designed to promote breeders and quality sport horses. Each series will consist of at least three qualifying events in designated geographical areas of the United States, which will lead to a final event in each series.

Grand champions will receive an embroidered cooler, neck sash and plaque. Reserve grand champions will receive a neck sash and plaque. These are all made possible by the generosity of the USDF Breeders' Championship Series sponsors.

Title Sponsor: Great American Insurance Group

Event Sponsors: Harmony Sporthorses, Hilltop Farm, Iron Spring Farm, Stargate Sporthorses

Contributing Sponsors: American Hanoverian Society, DG Bar Ranch, Greengate Sporthorses, Rainbow Equus Meadows

Exhibitors compete at qualifying events for the champion and reserve champion filly, colt/gelding, mare and stallion. These horses will be invited to compete in the final event of that series, which is where the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Filly, Colt/Gelding, Mare, and Stallion will be determined. Filly champions and reserves from each series qualifying event will compete together in the filly final class, and colt/gelding champions and reserves from each series qualifying event will compete together in the colt/gelding final class. Mare champions and reserves from each series qualifying event will compete together in the mare final class, and stallion champions and reserves from each series qualifying event will compete together in the stallion final class.

QUALIFYING SYSTEM

Each qualifying event must offer a filly championship class and a colt/gelding championship class. These classes are Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Qualifying Classes.

The filly and colt/gelding championship classes must be open to first- and second-placed* horses of sport horse prospect in hand classes for all horses age three-years old and under, as listed below:

Filly Championship:

Fillies of current calendar year
Yearling fillies
Two-year old fillies
Three-year old fillies

Colt/Gelding Championship:

Colts/geldings of current calendar year
Yearling colts/geldings
Two year old colts/geldings
Three-year old colts/geldings

The champion and reserve champion filly from each series qualifying event are eligible to compete in the series filly final class, and the champion and reserve champion colt/gelding from each series qualifying event are eligible to compete in the series colt/gelding final class.**

Each qualifying event must also name a mare champion and reserve and a stallion champion and reserve, which is (1) the first and second-placed mare, if only one mare class is held; and the first- and second-placed stallion, if only one stallion class is held OR (2) the first- and second-placed mare in the mare championship class, when two or more mare classes are held; and the first and second-placed stallion in the stallion championship class, when two or more stallion classes are held (classes may be broken into groups based on age, breeding status, or competition status). These classes are Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Qualifying Classes.

Mare and stallion championship classes, if held, must be open to first- and second-placed* horses of breeding stock in hand classes.

The champion and reserve champion mare from each series qualifying event are eligible to compete in the series mare final class, and the champion and reserve champion stallion from each series qualifying event are eligible to compete in the series stallion final class.**

Age/sex eligibility is determined as follows:

- Fillies and colts three years of age and under may show ONLY as sport horse prospects.
- Mares and stallions age four and over may show ONLY in Breeding Stock classes.
- Geldings of any age may NOT show in breeding stock classes/categories. Geldings age three and under may show ONLY in sport horse classes/categories.

No geldings may compete in the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship classes for stallions even if they are gelded after qualifying for the finals and are breeding via frozen semen.

The Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship classes must be held and judged. These Championships may not be awarded on the basis of previous scores.

Horses in all championship classes must be evaluated according to United States Equestrian Federation Art. 1944.5, which lists judging specifications for championship classes.

* Organizers have the option of including third place horses in championship classes.

** If the champion, reserve or both have already qualified for the Final class, the third-place horse will also be invited to compete in the Final

REQUIREMENTS

Filly champions and reserves from each series qualifying event will compete together in the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Filly Final Class, and colt/gelding champions and reserves from each series qualifying event will compete together in the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Colt/Gelding Final Class. Mare champions and reserves from each series qualifying event will compete together in the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Mare Final Class, and stallion champions and reserves from each series qualifying event will compete together in the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Stallion Final Class.

A grand champion and reserve grand champion filly, colt/gelding, mare, and stallion will be named at each series final event. Grand champions will receive an embroidered cooler, neck sash and plaque. Reserve grand champions will receive a neck sash and plaque. Third through sixth-placed horses in the series final classes will receive ribbons. Certificates will be given for all horses that compete in a series final class. Awards will be provided by USDF through the generous support of the series sponsors.

Awards may be withheld by USDF to series winners if the following information is not provided to USDF or show management prior to reporting or competition deadlines: name of horse, age, and sex of horse, USDF lifetime registration number (or USDF HID # for a qualifier), handler and owner. If known, the following must also be provided: breed of horse (even if grade), sire, dam, damsire, and breeder.

At least two judges (one of whom must be a licensed USEF DSHB judge) must officiate in each series final class. Each judge will evaluate each entry independently, and scribes must be provided for each judge. Winners will be determined by the average of all judges' scores. The highest-placed horse in each class will be declared grand champion and the second-highest placed horse will be declared reserve grand champion.

Horses must be shown individually on the triangle at the walk and trot and standing for conformation. Each horse must be evaluated in the same manner. DSHB sport horse prospects are evaluated on yellow score sheets; DSHB breeding stock horses are evaluated on pink score sheets. Callbacks are permitted.

Series final events must agree to allow late entries in the series final classes for horses that qualified after the official closing date for the final event. When qualifying classes are held in addition to the final class at the series final event, management must collect USDF lifetime horse registration and/or participating or business membership applications and fees for ineligible entries that wish to participate in the series final classes and submit these applications and fees to the USDF office within 24 hours of the final class.

Results of Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Final classes must include name of horse, USDF lifetime registration number (if fees and forms are not collected), age, sex, owner, and handler. If known the following must also be provided: breed of horse, sire, dam, damsire, and breeder.

RULES AND ELIGIBILITY

The Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series is scheduled on a calendar year basis (January 1-December 31).

If champions and/or reserve champions in any qualifying event have already qualified to compete in the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Final Class, only the third-placed horse in the qualifying class(es) (filly, colt/gelding, mare or stallion championships), will also be permitted to compete in their respective final class at the series final event.

A series final will be considered tentative until at least three qualifying events have been registered for the series. If a Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series does not have at least three qualifying events registered with USDF by June 1 of the final's year or at least twelve weeks before the date of the series final, the series final will not be held for the series. USDF reserves the right to combine series without the minimum number of qualifying events, and horses that have qualified for a series final in this case may participate in the series final of any other Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series in the same calendar year.

MEMBERSHIP/REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS

Horse:

- Must be USDF lifetime registered or pay a \$20 lifetime USDF horse identification number fee for qualifying events. The \$20 horse ID number fee is applicable toward USDF lifetime horse registration.
- Must be USDF lifetime registered to compete in a Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Final Class at the series final event.
- Horses and ponies of any origin may compete.
- Registration with a breed registry is not required.

Owner:

- USDF membership not required for qualifying events.
- Must be a current USDF participating or business member to compete at the series final class.

Handler(s):

- Handler: USDF membership not required. A USDF non-member number is also not required.

Verification of USDF membership and registration must be provided to management prior to the series final class.

USEF MEMBERSHIP NOT REQUIRED, BUT NON-MEMBER FEES APPLY

USDF HORSE HID OR USDF LIFETIME REGISTRATION NUMBER MAY BE USED AS THE USEF HORSE ID NUMBER

USDF Membership Benefits: USDF is dedicated to education, the recognition of achievement, and the promotion of the sport of dressage. For details on member benefits, including educational programs, awards, and other opportunities, refer to the USDF Directory or the USDF Web site at www.usdf.org. To participate in a USEF/USDF-recognized competition as an owner/lessee or rider, you must either be a USDF Group, Intercollegiate/Interscholastic, or Participating Member, or have a USDF Non-Member Identification Number. (Note: Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their Business membership.) Exception: Handler in DSHB classes or riders and owners competing in classes which are exempt from USDF HID requirements.



Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an *individual* directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. Participating memberships are available for 1-year (\$62), 5-years (\$250), or life (\$1,000). A Youth Participating Membership is available for members under 21 (as of the start of the current membership year) for \$35. A Participating Membership allows the member to compete at USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals, and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The Group Membership year ends November 30. A Group Membership allows the member to compete at USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards program.

Intercollegiate/Interscholastic Membership (IM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Intercollegiate/Interscholastic Member Organization (IMO). The membership year is December 1 through November 30. An Intercollegiate/Interscholastic Membership allows the member to compete at USDF-recognized competitions, and participate in the USDF Rider Awards program.

Non-Member Identification Number: An individual with a Non-Member ID is not eligible for any USDF awards nor eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes, or Great American Insurance Group/USDFBC Finals, or receive other USDF membership benefits. PMs, GMs, or IMs do not need a Non-Member ID to compete. The Non-Member number is downloadable from the USDF Web site, or USDF will print and mail a card for a \$10 fee.

Business Membership: A membership issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. There are two types of Business Membership: Standard (\$100) or Full (\$250). The Full Business Membership offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. Business Memberships satisfy requirements of horse ownership only. The membership year is December 1 through November 30.

USDF Horse Membership Defined

*****Horses competing at USDF-recognized shows must have either a Horse Identification Number or a Lifetime Registration. Exception:** Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBC) at DSHB competitions, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (i.e. all Arabian, Friesian or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux, quadrille, or IPEC classes, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot and academy classes. For foreign owned horses competing in CDI class, USDF accepts copies of the horse identification pages from an FEI passport, or a completed HID application (with no fee requirements) in lieu of a USDF HID or Lifetime Registration number.

Horse Identification Number (HID): A one-time tracking number for horses (\$20). Scores earned by a horse with an HID will be recorded, but will NOT be counted towards USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes or Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals. An HID can be upgraded to a Lifetime Registration for a fee of \$45. If a horse is Lifetime Registered it does not need an HID. An HID does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration: A horse with a Lifetime Registration (\$65) is eligible for USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals and Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse is Lifetime Registered it does not need an HID. A Lifetime Registration does not need to be renewed.
