Official Qualifying Competition for the 2010 FEI North American Junior and Young Riders Championships and 2010 USEF National Junior, Young Rider & Brentina Cup Championships.

OPEN SHOW INFORMATION

- In the Musical Freestyle Test of Choice be sure to list level on entry and include copy of 60% or better technical test.
- Open show classes/divisions with less than 4 entries may be canceled or combined.
- Management will do its best to schedule specified ** Open classes before Championship classes where appropriate.

Qualifying For 2009 RMDS Championships Qualifying Dates: 10/01/08-9/27/2009

- You need two qualifying scores, two different judges, and from two different shows, per level, see RMDS Standing Rules section XIV “Championship Show” paragraph B-4c for scores required.
 - Please Note: “These scores may be from any test at the specified level” (sec. XIV B-4a).
- You may attempt to earn your last qualifying score in the Open section of the Championship show (see sec. XIV B-1).
 - However, you MUST send in your championship entry form complete with entry in the Championship class you intend to qualify for on or before the Championship show closing date (see sec. XIV B-2).
- If you do *not* earn your final score in the Open section of the Championship show you will **NOT** get a refund for the RMDS Championship class that you were unable to qualify for (see sec. XIV B-3).
- Please note that RMDS Championship class rides DO count towards USDF year-end awards, but not for USDF Regional Championship Qualifying. If you want these scores to count, you must be eligible for USDF Year End Awards (USDF Participating Membership and USDF Lifetime Horse Registration).

RMDS CHAMPIONSHIP RULES

For your convenience we have printed selected sections of the current RMDS Standing Rules below:

- Scores from Championship Classes shall count in the RMDS Awards Program (sec. XIV A-2).

- Horse/rider combinations may compete in Championship Classes at a Maximum of 2 levels, which must be sequential (sec. XIV A-3).
- For Training through Fourth Level Championship Classes, horse/rider combinations are not eligible to compete in any Championship Classes if they have previously participated in any RMDS, USEF or USDF recognized competition at two or more levels higher. For FEI Championship Classes, horse/rider combinations may have previously competed at any FEI level (sec. XIV A-4).
- Horse/rider combinations that are RMDS Championship champions from previous years for Training Level through Fourth Level are not eligible to compete again in Championship Classes at the same level at which they were champions (sec. XIV A-5).
- Except for Musical Freestyle classes, the annual level champions for Adult Amateur, Junior/Young Rider, and Open divisions will be determined by riding the highest test at the level, which shall be judged by at least two judges. The horse/rider combination with the highest average for each division at the level shall be champions (sec. XIV A-6).
- Musical Freestyle Level Champions shall be determined by riding a single freestyle test at the qualified level that shall be judged by at least two (2) judges. The horse/rider combination with the highest average score for the test at each level shall be the Champion (sec. XIV A-7).
- **The championship awards will be presented at the Championship show in a formal awards ceremony. Failure of horse and rider recipients to appear in show dress and full tack for the ceremony (unless excused for cause by the show management) shall result in immediate disqualification. In event of disqualification, each affected award shall be presented to the next lower average score (sec. XIV A-9).**
- A rider in an RMDS Championship class may not carry a whip. (Exception: Riders riding sidesaddle may carry a whip in RMDS Championships). (Sec. XIV A-10)..
- Championship tests must be ridden from memory (sec. XIV A-11). No callers allowed.
- Rider must submit a copy of their current 2009 USEF Adult Amateur card to be eligible to ride as an Adult Amateur (sec. XIV A-12).
- In the event of a tie for Champion or Reserve, the collective marks will determine 1st, 2nd and 3rd place. Otherwise, the tie will remain unbroken. (Sec. XIV A-13)
- **Only the rider that has qualified on a specific horse may ride that horse during the Championship Show (Only 1 rider per horse for the show) (groom with a loose rein excepted).**

RMDS FUTURITY:

- Nominate your horse for the 2009 Futurity!
- No advance nominations are necessary, just mail in your futurity fees along with your entry form and appropriate classes and show entry fees for the 2 futurity classes.
- **Be sure to enter the two Futurity classes: classes 220 and 320 – you must ride in both classes!**
- The futurity is open to all horses six years and younger who have not shown above First Level.
- Futurity Nominating Fee: \$35 per horse.
- Prize money will be awarded to Champion and Reserve on a 60/40 split.
- Run under Championship rules.
- No prior Futurity Champion may enter.
- Provide proof of age in the form of papers or a vet certificate must be sent with entry.

Management Rules and Procedures

- Classes designated RMDS Championship classes shall be open ONLY to individual horse/rider combinations meeting the criteria described in the RMDS Standing Rules section XIV B. See the Standing Rules and qualifying requirements in the current RMDS Omnibus.
- During the competition, the performance arenas will be open to hand walking only up to one half hour prior to the start of the first class. No horses will be allowed in the performance arenas during breaks. On Wednesday and Thursday, priority will be given to arena setup and maintenance; however, schooling will be allowed on a limited basis.
- Both bridle numbers should be worn on each side of the horse when out of the stall.
- ALL dogs **must** be leashed and attached to a person or immovable object *at all times!* \$50 fine for all violations.
- Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. rulebook will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.
- Open show entries accepted on first come first served basis, based on the postmark with dates on and between open and close dates. Mail, fax or internet entries only
- Post entries accepted on first come first served basis with space available – including all RMDS Championship classes.
- Wait list will be maintained through Wednesday 8pm
- Management reserves the right to:
 - Add or cancel judges

- Combine, divide, limit or cancel classes
- Refuse entries for cause.
- Waive penalty fees
- **NO SMOKING IN BARN.**
- Riders may compete in only ONE division, no cross entering divisions: You must choose either Open *or* Adult Amateur *or* Junior. Exception: you may cross enter into the GREAT AMERICAN/USDF Qualifying division or the PONY division.
- Schooling (out of competition) horses may be brought to the show but must be registered on an entry form, with signatures and appropriate fees. Areas where they may be ridden in will be restricted, and priority given to horses in competition. Check with the show office for details.
- All horses entered in competition must have a USDF HID or Lifetime registration. All riders and owners must have a USDF nonmember ID, Group membership, or Participating membership and/or pay appropriate nonmember fees. All riders and owners must also have a USEF membership or pay appropriate nonmember fees.

Provisional ride times will be posted at www.rmids.org, and www.twowhitefeet.com. Official times will be posted at the show office by noon on Thursday. **Please check for changes each show day.**

- USEF non-member fee: **\$30**
- USDF affidavit fee: **\$5**

- RV hook up fee: **\$35/day**
- **INCLUDE WITH ENTRY;**
 - For Test of Choice Classes, state level and division on entry blank.
 - Copies of RMDS/USDF/USEF membership cards **MUST** be included with entry.
 - All out of state horses must have a current health certificate (within 30 days of show dates)

REFUNDS

The office fee is non-refundable. Entries cancelled on or before the closing date will receive a refund of all fees except the office fee. No refunds if cancelled after the closing date unless ride is filled from waitlist. Stabling refunded if cancelled before Tuesday, September 22, 2009. Waitlist maintained through Wednesday, September 23, 2009. No refunds of any kind for any reason including Acts of God from Thursday 24 September through Sunday September 27, 2009.

IMPORTANT: All cancellations must be made in writing and mailed, faxed, or e-mailed to show secretary. You are responsible to confirm that your cancellation has been received. Anyone not appearing for any of their dressage tests without prior notification to the show secretary will be “scratched” from their remaining classes. Those rides will be filled if possible.

STABLING – Bedding not included – ALL BEDDING MUST BE PURCHASED ON GROUNDS. NO OUTSIDE BEDDING ALLOWED – NEW FACILITY POLICY FOR 2009.

Championship horses MUST be stabled on the grounds from the time they arrive on the grounds until after their final Championship class award ceremony. For questions on this new policy, please call Heather.

- Haul-in fee: **\$30** per day (only if not doing a stall or paddock)
- Day Stall: **\$35** (6am – 6pm)
- Day Turnout Paddock: **\$35** (6am – 6pm)
- Overnight Stall: **\$40** (must be out by noon next day!)

- Overnight Tack Stall: **\$40** (must be out by noon next day!)
- Weekend Stall: **\$110** (Thurs – Sun, Weds-Sat, or Tues-Fri)
- Weekend Tack Stall: **\$110** (Thurs – Sun, Weds-Sat, or Tues-Fri)
- Extended Weekend Stall **\$140** (Tues – Sat or Weds – Sun)
- Extended Weekend Tack **\$140** (Tues – Sat or Weds – Sun)
- **Day stalls and overnight stalls will be stabled in separate area from package stalls.**
- Stalls are 12x12 permanent stalls with full sliding doors; stall fronts (including doors) are solid from midway down and bars from midway up.
- Stalls and Paddocks will be available at 12:00 noon on the Wednesday prior to show weekend.
- Priority will be given to stalls for horses before tack stalls if stabling fills.
- **Bedding - All bedding orders will be handled through the Colorado Horse Park. Pre-orders must be faxed to 303-841-7879 by 4pm Tuesday September 22. Feed office will be open Wednesday Noon-4pm, Thursday 8-4pm and other show days 8-10AM. All orders must go through the**
- **CHP feed office – the show office will not be able to help with bedding orders.**
- **ALL BEDDING MUST BE PURCHASED FROM THE FACILITY – NO OUTSIDE BEDDING MAY BE BROUGHT ON THE SHOW GROUNDS.**

AWARDS

- Open Show Classes: Ribbons through sixth place, first place prize.
- No awards or ribbons for qualifying divisions.
- Other fun & special awards may be awarded during the show, look in the show program for details.
- Breed associations and individuals are being contacted for breed awards as well, not all breeds may be represented. Send in a copy of your registration papers with entry to be eligible for these awards.
- Class #206 – Dover Adult Amateur Award – Second Level Test 3. For more information on the USDF/Dover Adult Amateur Medal Program, please go to <http://www.usdf.org/Programs/DoverAdultAmateurMedal.asp>.
- RMDS Championship awards: A trophy and neck ribbon to Champions, Reserve Champions awarded a neck ribbon, ribbons through eighth place.

ARENAS

- Outdoor arenas have all weather sand mix footing.
- All tests will be ridden in an outdoor 20x60 arena.
- Warm-up arenas have comparable footing.
- NO LUNGEING in warmup arenas – use lungeing pads only.
- Coaching may be done from the outside of the arenas ONLY.
- Competition arenas will be open for schooling on set-up day, Wednesday and/or Thursday (before show weekend) until posted close time in show office.
